Constitution OF The IRISH VOLUNTEERS Óglaigh na hÉireann

Reconstituted from 25th Oct 1914 at IRB GHQ on 17th June 2023

I - Objects

1. To secure and maintain the rights and liberties common to all the People of Ireland
2. To train, discipline, and equip for this purpose an Irish Volunteer Force within Post of Peace to Correct and Set and Protect the Position of the Sovereign Republic of Éire for the People of Ireland.
3. To unite in the service of Ireland, Irishmen and Irishwomen of every creed and of every party and class.

II - Enrolment Form to be signed by all Ireland Volunteers

"I, the undersigned, desire to be enrolled for service in Ireland as a Member of the Irish Volunteer Force, a Post of Peace, with the Objective to Correct and Set and Protect the Position of the Sovereign Republic of Éire for the People of Ireland, and I undertake to uphold the integrity of the Constitution of the Organisation"

III - Scope and System of the Organisation

1. The Organisation of the Irish Volunteers will extend throughout all Ireland.
2. Every body of Irishmen and/or Irishwomen, whether in Ireland or abroad, who band themselves together to attain the stated objects, who sign the Enrolment Form, and who subscribe to the Constitution of the IRISH VOLUNTEERS/Óglaigh na hÉireann, will be eligible for recognition as a corps of Irish Volunteers.
3. The Flags of The IRISH VOLUNTEERS/Óglaigh na hÉireann are the Naval Flag, the Air Corps Flag and the Irish Republic Flag as set out in the First Schedule attached hereto. The Irish Republic Flag will stand above 1919mm in the Republican Courts as recognition of Jurisdiction of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts.
4. The Irish Republic Flag, the Naval Flag and the Air Corps Flag will all stand above 1919mm in the Military Court when in session as recognition of the Jurisdiction of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts.
5. There shall be an Executive of The IRISH VOLUNTEERS/Óglaigh na hÉireann consisting of Commander in Chief, General, Lieutenant General and Director of Military Prosecutions and the decision of any three is binding on all.

IV - Government of The IRISH VOLUNTEERS/Óglaigh na hÉireann

1. All powers of making , modifying, and amending the Constitution of The IRISH VOLUNTEERS/Óglaigh na hÉireann will reside henceforth in the AGM of the Supreme Council of the Irish Republican Brotherhood, or, if the need arises at an EGM of the Organisation.
2. An EGM may be held at any time on requisition of at least one third of affiliated Members in writing to the Executive of the Military Council of the Irish Republican Brotherhood.

Declaration of Policy

Adopted by the IRB at GHQ 17th June 2023

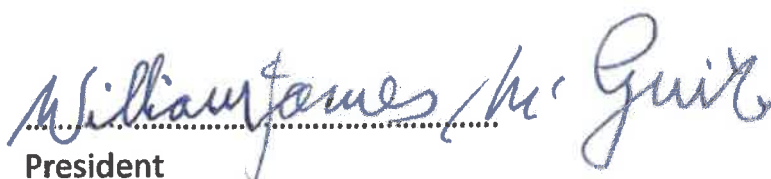
1. To maintain the right and duty of the Irish Nation henceforth to provide for its own defence by means of an educated and trained Volunteer Force in Post of Peace.
2. To unite the People of Ireland on the basis of Irish Nationality and a Common National Interest; to maintain the integrity of the Nation and to resist any and all measures tending to bring about or perpetuate disunion or the partition of our Country.
3. To secure the abolition of the system of governing Ireland through foreign owned corporations, and the establishment of a National Government in its stead for, of, and by the People of Ireland.
