## 1. Legal Proceedings: The "Dolphin" Case

- A High Court Plenary Summons was issued and served on Pat Mulherrin and An Bord Pleanála concerning the local "Dolphin" development by a Community Co-Op Member Colm Granahan as Plaintiff.
- The Plaintiff specifically chose a different route to the regulated judicial review process, in order that stamping the proceedings could continue through the Éire Courts if necessary.
- An Bord Pleanála engaged by entering an appearance and requesting a formal statement of claim.
- Pat Mulherrin initially failed to enter an appearance but did so four days after being served a 28-day notice warning that judgement in default would be sought.
- A Statement of Claim has now been sent to the defendants, providing them with 28 days to submit a formal defence.
- The total cost of lodging these legal documents in the Central Office was €190.
- The Plaintiff intends to post the High Court record number on his EIRE Tab so that the wider public can search and view the filed documents online.

## 2. Financial and Structural Updates

- The National Economic Council was publicly highlighted today, and 296 individuals have already engaged to seek further information about it.
- The Éire Community's next "minting" session will take place in May/June TBC
- Members can obtain an Authenticated Birth Certificate for a fee of €30, which the Éire Community Council and Co-op uses for the financial bond process.
- When a bond is minted, a specific digital sum is allocated to the individual, while nine-tenths of the generated value goes directly into the community treasury.
- The Organisation is developing a banking app, which they expect to be advanced by 21 January next year.
- This proposed banking system aims to provide low-interest loans (estimated at 1% to 2%) to community members for purposes such as building a house, with all loans approved by the council table.

## 3. Political Strategy: Irish Home Affairs & 2029 Elections

- The Organisation operates under the mandate of the 1916 Declaration and subsequent 32-county election victory in 1918 where I.R.B. Sinn Féin won 73 of the 105 seats. This is the mandate held by the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB), which was resealed in February 2022.
- The group plans to establish a political branch called "IRBHome Affairs" and intends to run candidates in the local elections scheduled for 2029.
- Any candidate representing the community must take a oath prior to taking office.
- Elected representatives will be required to bring all corporate government issues back to the community for a vote; if they fail to act in accordance with the community's wishes, they will be removed.
